The Embassy of the Republic of Poland presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Latvia and has the honour to convey the following information on the COVID-19 related restrictions on entry to the Republic of Poland currently being in place.

If a person is fully vaccinated against COVID-19 with a vaccine registered in the European Union and 14 days elapsed since receiving the final dose of the vaccine and that person can present a certificate of vaccination, they are exempt from quarantine when entering the territory of the Republic of Poland. Such a certificate shall be issued in Polish or English and shall contain the following information:

- Full name and surname of the vaccinated person;
- Information that the person received a full cycle of vaccination;
- Name of the vaccine.

The holder of such a certificate is not included in the total number of individuals allowed to gather or in the limit of hotel clients.

The Embassy of the Republic of Poland kindly informs that the Republic of Poland has joined the EU Digital Covid Certificate (UCC) system which enters into force on 1 July 2021. The EU Digital Covid Certificate will be issued in three cases:

- A person has undergone an infection – on the basis of a positive result of a PCR test proving infection, not earlier than 11 days since receiving the result; the certificate will be valid for 180 days;
- A person has received a negative test result (PCR or antigen) – in Poland such a certificate will be valid for 48 hours since testing;
- A person has received a full cycle of vaccination – such a certificate will be valid for 12 months.

UCC are issued free of charge in both electronic and paper forms.

Till the end of June 2021 both the Polish and UCC systems will be in place. From 1 July only UCC will be issued. However the Polish certificates will be still valid till the expiry date presented on them.

The Embassy of the Republic of Poland kindly presents samples of EU Digital Covid Certificate issued in the Republic of Poland and the Polish certificate of vaccination against COVID-19. The electronic certificates are issued to Polish citizens in “mObywatel” and “mojeIKP” applications.

The Embassy of the Republic of Poland avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Latvia the assurances of its highest consideration. *mm*
